Overview



In 2015, the Australia-Indonesia Centre, alongside Indonesia's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, launched the Australia-Indonesia Leaders Program to ensure that future leaders from government, business and academia in both nations developed strong relationships as they move into national leadership positions.

The program aims to:

- 1. Engage a highly influential network of emerging leaders in both nations.
- 2. Enable exchange of knowledge, understanding and skills to address shared challenges.
- 3. Foster ongoing relationships and new partnerships between alumni delegates.

Executive Summary



The Australia-Indonesia Centre delivered the third Australia-Indonesia Leaders Program on May 18-27, 2016 in Sydney, Melbourne and Canberra.

Throughout the program, 28 delegates engaged with over 100 government, business and academic leaders from both nations in a series of leadership courses with 5 universities, 3 VIP dinner functions and a range of cultural activities.

The third Australia-Indonesia Leaders Program marked several key milestones. For the first time:

- The Indonesian government, through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, co-invested financially in the program.
- Australian delegates from government and universities joined Indonesian delegates for the program.
- A leading Indonesian university Paramadina University delivered a leadership course alongside Australian universities.
- The program theme is aligned with the Centre's research agenda in energy.
- The program delivered all content through digital platforms, including a mobile app.





How valuable was the program in increasing your skills and knowledge?




